Dear St. Francis of Assisi Parent:

The Yorba Linda Water District is pleased to report that we are prepared to begin construction of the Hidden Hills Reservoir Project. The project includes the construction of the two-million gallon Hidden Hills Reservoir and improvements to the Santiago Booster Pump Station. The map on the reverse side shows the local community and the location of the reservoir and booster pump station.

The planned start date for construction is May 11, 2009. The reservoir construction will require extensive earthwork which may begin later that week. The project will generate excess dirt which will be hauled away in trucks. The dirt removal by trucks may require six to eight weeks, working Monday through Friday, 7am to 4pm. We understand that this may impact the time you both drop off and pick up your child from school. The haul route for the trucks approved by the City of Yorba Linda is shown on the map so that you may also plan your driving route accordingly. No dirt removal is required for the improvement work at Santiago Booster Pump Station.

Once the dirt removal is completed, less truck traffic is anticipated per day. However, some truck traffic will continue daily throughout the 14-month construction period. All trucks and other construction vehicles are required to comply with the speed limits and traffic laws of the City, which will be enforced by the local police. Yorba Linda Water District and City representatives will be present throughout the construction period to assure that measures are enforced to meet traffic, safety, noise and dust control, and other requirements of the project. Street sweeping will also be performed by the contractor on a regular basis.

At 7:00 pm Tuesday evening, May 5, District staff will make a short presentation to the Yorba Linda City Council on the planned construction of the Hidden Hills Reservoir Project at City Hall, 4845 Casa Loma Ave, Yorba Linda. You are invited to attend or to watch the Council meeting on local cable channel 3.

In addition, project information will be regularly updated on the Yorba Linda Water District website at www.ylwd.com. Your cooperation and understanding is appreciated as we move forward with this important water project to serve the local community, which is anticipated to be completed by September of 2010.
